Supplies:

- Walking foot for your sewing machine
- Fabric, preferably bouclé or loosely woven fabric, wool, wool blends, silk blends
- Lining, Chanel linings are usually patterned and brightly colored, toning with jacket fabric
- Thread - at least 3 to 4 spools of the color you desire.
- Pattern - I've recommended several on the recommendation page [here](#).
- Sewing machine
- Regular sewing tools: scissors, nippers, seam ripper, and any other tools you like to use around the machine.
- An assembled muslin of your jacket for the first class.

Skill level

There are basic techniques used in making the jacket, which most medium to advanced sewists have. The most difficult skill you will need is inserting a jacket sleeve into the jacket and making a bound. But there are other tasks, such as cutting straight bias strips, adding extra seam allowances, developing hand made trims and other techniques, which are totally manageable and doable even by the most basic sewists. That said, this jacket requires time and learning this basic skills, so it's really not a time to experiment with a different look. Keep the style and pattern as basic and classic as the jacket style.

What to bring to class for the first session:

Please bring a sewn/assembled muslin of your jacket, and I will fit each person. We will fit the first afternoon, then take the pattern apart, draw our seam allowances and cut the next day and begin basting. We will also discuss quilting patterns for each student so that the quilting will match the specific fabric and the lining of each garment.
